After clicking the “Used Books for Sale” link again in the new version, individuals will be taken to the website listing books for sale.

Kindles and Other e-book Readers:

Many of the required books are available much more cheaply in electronic format than printed (and weigh a lot less!). Kindles or other e-readers are welcome, but parents should approach that decision with great discretion. Our school policy is that laptops, Kindles, tablets and other similar devices [phones and mp3 players are not allowed to be used at all] can be used solely for reading or taking notes (i.e. not for any other purpose during school hours, including breaks). These devices must be in “airplane mode” (without any wireless or cellular connections) throughout the school day. Our experience has been that the temptation, especially for underclassmen, to send or receive a text, browse the Internet, check email or use electronic devices in some other way that is not allowed (play a game, play a video, etc.) has proven too much for most students.

Further, most of the time active reading is helped by taking notes. A student could jot down notes electronically or in a notebook, but reading a physical book with a pencil in hand continues to be the most effective plan for most students.
